E) Action Items

Curriculum Guide: The Chair will make a calendar of curriculum item training topics for the future meetings. It will be a standing item on our agenda and we'll ask members to sign up for topic. They will be responsible for providing training and leading discussion on the topic at a Curriculum Committee meeting. Presentations could be made available on the website for faculty to use when creating course revisions or new courses.

Cultural Curriculum Audit: Some ideas were to

- invite faculty in disciplines with larger equity gaps,
- incorporate new faculty
- focus on metamajors as a way to organize participants

- use the Equity Rubric dimensions when evaluating course outline and proposing changes
- ensure that faculty leave the retreat with a fully complete course revision proposal so that proposed improvements are translated from personal classroom strategies to Course Outline of Record where practical.
- Partner with Senate, SSEC, O & A and sponsor Cultural Curriculum Audit using the Long Beach City College model.
- Procure funding for facilitator and faculty stipends
- v. Curriculum 2021 Review: status update report
  - There are approximately 255 courses (our of ~720 active courses) that need review in 2021 in order to stay current. Email has gone out to faculty with the list of courses that need to be revised.
