4. GOVERNANCE COUNCIL EVALUATION

Michele Peregrin asked council members to take 10-15 minutes to complete the governance council evaluation survey sent by the President's office. The survey link was shared via email and chat with the council.

5. GRANTS REPORT/ROUNDTABLE

Jackie Cruz announced the grant award from The United Way- Rental and Utility Assistance. This initiative invited applicants to serve as partner agencies in advertising the program, vetting applications, and disbursing funds to cover rental and/or utility arrears (or make advance payments of up to three months). The program would be available to students and their families. Two of three positions have been hired for this program.

Cesar Velazquez shared information on the talent search grant. There was a meeting with the Department of Education and they gave an update stating award recipients would be announced by September 1, 2021. The grant has a September 1st start date so somehow they

will be announcing and having things up and running on the same day. Cesar thanked the Foundation team for their assistance and setting up the meeting with the Pebble Beach Company.

Ana Gonzalez shared an update regarding the Salinas Valley Education Consortium. There will be a slight increase in funds from the state. No budget cuts.

Michele mentioned there are 3 private grants in the works:

- \$50K requested from the Community Foundation for Monterey County- Community Impact Grant- requests support for the Salinas Valley Promise program, which provides area youth with critical resources to enroll, persist and complete college in order to foster a more vibrant, prosperous and secure community.
- \$50K applied for from the Nancy Buck Ransom Foundation- will consider a grant to support areas of greatest need in light of the COVID-19 crisis.
- \$9,075 applied from the Infosys Foundation- requested grant applications that engage K-12 students in STEM via maker activities. The project focuses on using Arduino kits and building sensors in a remote learning environment.

Jackie Cruz stated the Foundation is focusing on:

- Gaining support from Natividad for a student run clinic.
- Re-igniting its relationship with the California Endowment.
- Hiring a Director of Philanthropy.

Moises Almendariz stated at this point the anticipated opening or announcement of a new title III STEM competition is probably another 3-4 weeks away. Things have been hindered due to a number of different reasons, which has delayed competition. With the new administration in place, they have to review the programs. The announcement of a new Title III competition is going to happen, but delayed.

David Techaira gave an update on the business office side. The office has gone through the majority of the fiscal year without the grants manager potion, but an offer been made and they hope to fill that position.

The next person in this position will report directly to the President. Jackie stated this position interacts directly with the president and board of trustees, so this reporting makes sense.
