
Evaluate student perceptions/attitudes on a return to inperson learning

Do you want to return to campus (i.e., take in-person courses)?





In-person lessons following safety protocols (ASHC, Q2)




When Hartnell resumes in-person learning following safety protocols:

How comfortable do you feel about returning to campus in the near future (e.g., 2021FA)?




57% (n=424) were slightly/very uncomfortable returning to campus in 2021FA, with biggest concern (87%) being personal/family health (ASHC, Q4)

PPE Utilization (ASHC, Q5)




Will you support having teachers, students and visitors wear masks and other Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) when the campus reopens?

77.3% said that they have already or would receive a COVID vaccination 68.1% said that it's extremely important (mandatory) or very important to vaccinate all students, faculty, staff and administrators before resuming in person learning (ASHC, Q7).

Individual Comments (Cont.)
