1. Student Success Conference Update

Ms. Whitmore gave a detailed presentation regarding the Student Success Conference. The conference will be held on January 21- 22, 2021. Day one will include a welcome from Dr. Raul Rodriguez, Superintendent/President. There will also be presentations regarding the employee giving campaign, a data presentation, and a Guided Pathways presentation. There will be an outcomes and assessment session with Cheryl O'Donnel as well as breakout sessions with deans. Day two will include a presentation by Ben Percy. He will be a guest author with a topic on Recognizing the Hard Turn. An Equity Task Force presentation from Jackie Cruz will be given as well on day two. The keynote speaker is Dr. Sara Goldrick-Rab. She will be addressing students basic needs with a culture of caring. There will also be two breakout sessions. 2. Measure T

Mr. Reyes shared that they broke ground with the Castroville project last month. The plan is for that project to be completed by the spring of 2022. Building J and Building K are being programmed for the remodel. It takes about 3 ½ years for Building J and K to be completed. The top floor of building B remodel will begin next Fall. The elevator in Building D has passed the City of Salinas inspection. The exterior of the elevator is also complete. The nursing building is getting the metal stud framing, rough in of the plumbing, electrical and fire sprinkler systems are scheduled to continue through November. Work on the Building B, 2nd floor is pending completion of the nursing building. The focus on the Soledad Center is completing the electrical, mechanical systems as well as wire pulling for IT/Data and fire systems. Painting of the interior and exterior continues through next week. For the King City Center, installation of the ceiling grids, door hardware installation, casework in the labs and fume hoods continues and interior painting moves on. 3. Salinas Valley Promise Presentation

Mrs. Moreno and Mrs. Obana gave a presentation regarding the Salinas Valley Promise program. Their presentation is located on the council website for review. The Salinas Valley Promise Program offers two years free in-state tuition regardless of household income. When accepted into the program, students are able to obtain the following benefits: a free laptop or textbook voucher, participation in a summer learning institute, quarterly professional development workshops with fellow Promise students, faculty champions advocating students in each cohort, and mentoring by local professional (year 2 only). To be eligible for the program, students must be a graduate of a high school or adult school in the state of California, they must be first time college students (inclusive of dual enrollment students), and students must also enroll full-time (at least 12 units or more). Students must also submit the FAFSA or the California Dream Act application, participate in the summer leadership institute or enroll in a cohort based partner program, participate in professional development

workshops and mentorship (year 2 of program), and maintain at least a 2.0 semester GPA. Please review the presentation that contains the most up to date data pertaining to the program.
