INFORMATION/DISCUSSION/PRESENTATIONS

1. New Student Online Orientation Aron Szamos
Mr. Szamos and Mrs. Johnson gave a demonstration of the new online orientation. The new orientation went live in March. The Spanish version will be available soon.
2. Go Fund Me for Emergency Loans Jackie Cruz
The foundation is looking into the possibility for students to keep the laptops that were given to them with this funding. Shawn shared the message on Canvas that sends students to a sign up site to reserve a laptop and/or hotspot if needed.
3. Panther Prep Pledge Ariana Rodriguez
Ms. Rodriguez shared that they will be holding a panther prep pledge event. High School students will complete an application, orientation, and placement to be eligible to register for the May 18 event. The pledge is an intent to attend Hartnell after graduation. By pledging, students obtain registration guidance, assistance with Ed plans, fall priority registration, and get a swag bag mailed to them.
4. Crisis Counseling Update Carol Kimbrough
There are 5 students on the wait list. There is a new counselor starting May 1 that will help with the load. There are some legal and technical challenges with moving to the new online format. They have a huge response from students for online counseling sessions.
5. Commencement 2020 Update Augustine Nevarez
There will be a virtual commencement on May 24 at 5:30pm. The event will be pre-recorded and based on the 5 meta-majors. This would limit the amount of wait time for the student's name to be called in alphabetical order. Some pro's from this format is that the new format allows for as many family members as they'd like involved in their commencement. Before there were a limited number of tickets students could use for their families to attend the ceremony. They are working on Spanish interpretation with the video company to add subtitles. Sign language interpretation will also be available on the video. Students have asked to participate in the next graduation rather than this one. Augustine stated that is not an option at the moment as that would impact the ceremony for students graduating in 2021 due to the lack of space for two graduating classes at Rabobank Stadium. The naming of the student provides a slide of the student picture as well as a message for family or any message they would like to send out. Their name would be called out. It would be more personalized rather than the actual in person ceremony. The ceremony is typically 2 hours. This ceremony is anticipated to be between 45mins – 1 hour.
6. Hunger Free Campus Augustine Nevarez
There is a pop up pantry this Friday and two additional ones on May 8 and May 23. They are

prepared to hand out 144 bags of food. They have been distributing food every other week since the start of the semester. The food is being handed out by adhering to the social distancing guidelines and wearing masks. The students come in through the parking structure and receive it at the other end and drive out.
