III. Old Business:

3.01 ASHC Appointments Advisor Nevarez Action

This item provided an update on the ASHC appointments and vacancies A couple of weeks ago we decided to have appointments instead of an election. Two emails went out – 15 applications were received.

Today people introduced themselves followed by an in-house vote for the new members. Each person answered two questions – "why did you sign up for student council" and "what goals would you have if elected?"

Forrest emailed the voting form to all student council members and the following candidates were selected:

3.02Retreat/OrientationAdvisor NevarezDiscussionThis item provided an update on the summer retreat- on August 11th & 12th, 2022. Most likely at 8 AM - 5 PM

Day 1 will be at The Harden Foundation Day 2 will be at the Castroville center

Breakfast and lunch will come from Costco which will cost about 300For our activity we're going to do either escape room or kayaking which both come out to 45/person = 1100 total for the activity.

Appolonia suggested using the summer budget for the event.

David Orta said that he had a scheduling conflict on the 12th – he has an 8-hour internship presentation.

IV. New Business:

4.01 CCCSSA Leadership Conference Pres. Preciado Discussion/Action

This item discussed the options of attending the upcoming CCCSAA conference.

Forest and Augustine are members of the organization CCCSSA as advisors.

CCCSSA holds workshops for professional development for advisors and students and this year is an in-person conference in San Diego.

Taking ASHC officers to the conference for leadership development and advocacy on October 21st-23rd (Saturday all day, Sunday morning, and coming back on Sunday) will be expensive:

Registration, transportation, meals, and lodging will cost about \$1000 each student where the mode of transportation is flying from wherever it's cheapest.

It will include 2 nights of lodging.

Augustine suggested we use 2 funds accounts to request and cover the amounts to go to the conference.

- **Travel and Comforts** in the ASHC budget (to be created)
- **Representation Fee** (the \$2 representation fee) there's about \$55,000 total in coffers

The total for our trip is estimated to be \$18,100 so \$20,000 is the blanket amount that we're looking at to attend the conference.

\$10k from Rep Fee

\$10k from Travel and Comforts

Appolonia suggested a motion for \$20,000 for the CCCSAA conference.

Gulliermo motioned

Wilfredo seconded

[The OWL Camera froze at this time]

A vote took place and the motion passed.

4.02 Review of the Budget Treasurer Cabello Discussion

4.03 Owl 360 Camera Secretary David Orta Informational/Action

This item covered some technical information about the Owl 360 meeting camera and suggested the assignment of 2 backup volunteers to operate it in the absence of Forrest.

The OWL Camera allows the student council to hold a more inclusive hybrid meeting experience. This ensures equal access to student services **available in the student council** to those who do no live within a close distance to the main Salinas campus (where the in-person meetings take place).

The importance of the OWL Device enables Hartnell College to have a more meaningful connection with students and community members that span across the geographically-dispersed college community – Salinas and Castroville area to Soledad and King City zones.

Secretary David Orta stated the critical importance of having the conference camera operable and working to ensure that we continue creating an inclusive environment that respects and appreciates the time of all of our students no matter where they live. He asked for 2 volunteers to operate the camera. Apolonia suggested that everyone learn how to operate the camera, just in case the designated volunteers are absent.

Augustine also suggested that student council members hold the responsibility of operating the conference camera instead of Forrest.

David O. was asked to contact the IT department and confirm that we can keep a conference camera in the Office of Student Life and **request a dedicated laptop to pair with the OWL from IT**.
